# Pegasus Summer Program

## Warm Weather Attire Rules

Warm weather presents hazards for our riders when they are not wearing appropriate clothing. Shorts may NOT be worn by riders unless they have a specific note from the rider's doctor stating that they need to be allowed to wear shorts for medical reasons. Any rider coming to lessons in shorts will receive a warning. The next time the rider comes to lessons in shorts without the doctor's note, the rider will not be permitted to ride, but will still be charged for the lesson. Also, for safety reasons, ONLY sneakers or boots are allowable footwear for lessons. If a rider comes to lessons in anything other than boots or sneakers they will NOT be allowed to ride and will be charged for the lesson. No warnings!



# Pegasus Heat Policy

Lessons will be cancelled when the HEAT INDEX is over 95. Pegasus staff carefully monitors this condition since we are sensitive to the effects that heat and humidity can have on our riders, horses, volunteers, and staff. Decisions as to cancellations are made at 4 pm for weeknight classes and by 8:30 am for weekday classes. All riders and volunteers will be contacted if lessons are cancelled.
